This week in Literacy we have focused on using time conjunctions appropriately and not just repeatedly using then. Using the time conjunctions we wrote a recount about our school trip last week. In Numeracy we have looked at data in the form of bar charts. We wrote sentences about what information we could tell from it and then we put the same information into a pictogram. In Science we thought about living, once lived and never lived items and wrote explanations about each criteria. We've created an information poster about seaside holidays in the past, using the knowledge that we learnt from our visit last week.

This week in Farnhill class we have been building our models of a landmark from Bradley village as part of our history and geography topic on our local area. This week we have been building, sticking and fastening our structures together. It has been great to see the structures start to come to life over the course of the week. Later in the week, we have been Papier-mâchéing our landmarks. The next stage will be to add finer details and begin painting them. We have been completing some end of year assessments in Farnhill class to capture how far the class has come this year with their learning. The children have been busying supporting the Year 6 pupils in preparation for the Leaver's performance by singing songs and joining in with actions. Have a great weekend and see you all on Monday.

Time is racing on in Class 4, not many days left! In maths we have been converting several fractions to the lowest common denominator so that we can add them. Then we changed improper fractions to mixed numbers. We had to think carefully, which was the lowest common denominator; again, good knowledge of multiplication tables was vital.

Following our visit to Skipton, when we carried out a survey of the shops on the High Street, we created a graph to show the results. We are now able to work out the scale and organise the results independently. We found it a lot easier to compare our results in graphical form.

In English we have been analysing information leaflets, looking for persuasive phrases that draw you in. We also considered the layout, pictures, information and colour used: were they interesting for the reader? We then planned our own leaflets to persuade families to visit Skipton for a day out. The children had many excellent ideas about what would appeal, or not, to families. We will incorporate our learning from the visit into the information leaflet. In art we are continuing to work on creating watercolour pictures of Skipton Castle, mixing realistic shades of stone carefully.

We are all enjoying reading and performing poetry, poet's corner is a daily favourite; our volume and expression are improving well.
