This week has been really busy. In our numeracy, we have been work on solving worded problems involving the four operations. We are much better at being able to draw and record our workings, and explain how we arrived at an answer. In literacy, we have looked at riddles. These have been linked to our topic of mini-beasts, and some will be read out in our class assembly. Another week has flown by and we've been busy as always. This week in Literacy we have had the chance to write our own page to be included in our school report. We spent time thinking about all the things we have enjoyed over the year and then we had to think of something we would like to get better at during next year. We look forward to sharing these with you later in the term when our reports are sent home. In Numeracy we have been calculating - addition and subtraction. We have been reminding ourselves of different methods that we can use when answering sums and have practised these with sums involving one-digit numbers and sums involving multiples of 10. In Science this week we have learnt about the life cycle of a butterfly. This is because we have caterpillars in our class room and we are enjoying watching them develop into butterflies. At the moment they are all in their chrysalis. On Wednesday afternoon some of us used the Chrome Books to develop our programming skills while some of us completed weaving activities to develop our fine motor skills. Yesterday morning the Year 1 children from Class 1 joined us while the new Reception children had their first visit. We were lucky that the sun was shining and we were able to go onto the field to practise our Sports Day races. Yesterday afternoon, with Mr Rogers, we enjoyed learning about Bradley the puppy who is being trained to be a Medical Detection Dog like Holly who helps Miss Halstead.

Farnhill Class

This week in Farnhill class we have been busy writing a newspaper report regarding our school trip to Bradford and the children have really put in every effort. This piece of work really showcases how much they class have improved with their writing over the course of the academic year. In PE, the children are understanding the rules of rounders and athletics. In science, we have been learning about the inspirational Marie Curie and discovering how she was in a league of her own amongst a male dominated environment. The children studied her life and made a booklet to explain her achievements, life story and detailed the legacy that she left behind. In geography the class have been identifying the main rivers across the UK as well as stating the seas that they lead to. In mathematics, the class have been involved with statistics and learning about Carrol and Venn diagrams.

Linton Class

It has been a busy and hardworking week in Class 4, in maths we have been revising prime, square and cubed numbers and sorting out misconceptions. We have continued to read timetables and use a timeline to work out lengths of time as well as differences. We have also extended our understanding of rounding off, to decimal places and larger whole numbers. In science we drew diagrams of the water cycle and investigated reversible and irreversible changes. We have set up an investigation in the classroom with salt water to observe whether we can separate the salt from the solution. In writing we have written our own reports about how we feel the year has gone- this has been very interesting and we hadn't realised how much we have learnt over the year and how busy we have been. In ICT we have continued to learn how to programme using Scratch. Our PE lesson was very exciting, we played rounders, our throwing, catching and batting skills have improved tremendously! Year 5s have worked on Reading Comprehension, just practising areas where we are weak, everyone has improved significantly this term. We are now reading the book "Wonder" as a whole class text which has sparked good discussions.

Grassington Class

This week has been very much centred around working on our Enterprise projects. All the year 6 members of the class have been busy preparing, and then delivering, their presentations to the rest of the school and we are all gearing up to fulfilling the orders next week!

Although the year 5's are not involved in the Enterprise, they have encouraged the others and I'm sure are picking up some good ideas and tips for when they do it next year. Whilst the year 6 have been otherwise engaged, the year 5 children have completed a tricky maths investigation where they had to calculate using negative numbers to decipher a code. They demonstrated some excellent team work.

We have also been looking at the artist Rousseau in relation to his 'jungle' paintings, which look very much like pictures of the rainforest, and have started to make our own collage pictures following his style. They are very colourful.
