We have reached our last week before the half term break and seemed to have crammed so much into a rather short half term at school.

We've made it to the half term. This week has been very enjoyable - but very busy! On Monday in our literacy lesson, we followed a recipe to bake our own gingerbread men and ladies. We wrote our own recipes for how to make gingerbread men, later on in the week. On Tuesday, we all dressed up and welcomed our mums and dads to our fairy tale afternoon. It was such fun having our parents join in with the lovely activities. Thank you for coming, everyone! Your thoughts about the stay and play afternoon, are very much appreciated. In maths this week, we have re-capped on partitioning in to hundreds, tens and units. We are very confident in identifying the value of each digit in 2 and 3 digit numbers. We are already looking forward to returning to school for our Mexican Day - where we will be cooking, then eating, Mexican food...and having a dance to Mexican music with a piñata. Cracoe Class 2:

We've come to the end of the term and everyone has worked hard this week. Miss Wright made the Yr2 children work very hard completing maths and reading booklets but everyone worked very well and tried their best. In Literacy we have been looking at acrostic poems; as a class we wrote one about Spring and then individually we wrote one about Summer. In Numeracy we have been investigating and solving problems as well as continuing number sequences. In Science we have been thinking about habitats and even used collage materials to make pictures of them. In Art this week we looked at patterns that appear on material in South Africa. We used printing techniques to make our own pattern around the edge of the paper and then drew a picture of something that was important to us in the middle. This morning with Miss Bell we have learnt about the story of The Good Samaritan and used drama to act it out.

Farnhill Class 3:

This week in Farnhill class the children have been working ever so hard to complete their assessments in mathematics, reading and GPS (Grammar Punctuation and Spelling). In English the children have been finishing the conclusion to their stories for their version of Orion and the Dark 2. In mathematics, the class having been using the formal written method to divide 3-digit numbers. In geography, the children studied further similarities and differences between Sherwood Forest and the Amazon rainforest. Have a great bank holiday weekend and half term break.

Linton Class 4:

It's been a fun week in Class 4, we had a fantastic field trip to Wycoller Park and the weather was extremely kind! Pond dipping was a great success, we even caught a flatworm and a toad- and no one fell in. Measuring the river required a lot of mathematical skills, finding the depth, the width and the speed. This involved plenty of string and a variety of balls! We all enjoyed being in the water, collecting and comparing pebbles on a sunny afternoon. Also this week we have been using our debating skills: for and against electronic devices. We held real debates in small groups with a chairperson keeping control. Many children were really brave and spoke out with great expression, followed by some heckling from the audience. We then voted, with no surprises who the winners were! We are now writing a two sided argument, comparing points of view. In maths we have been learning to round off, including the use of decimals. We have also spent some time researching pond creatures ready for our visit.

Grassington Class:

In maths this week we have been concentrating on geometry-constructing 2 D shapes using given angles and dimensions. It was quite tricky with lots of accurate angle measuring and a bit of problem solving too.

Nearly everyone has finished writing their leaflet promoting Bradley School; using persuasive language and thinking about all the good things we offer. It was amazing how many positive ideas we came up with.

We made good use of the sunshine during our science lesson when we went outside and made rainbows using prisms and the sunlight-we had some very pretty patterns. This was followed up by making spinners to demonstrate the primary colours going back to white.

On Monday, Mrs Busfield organised some very popular shelter building activities in the Wildlife Area. Most of the class managed to take part and enjoy this fun lesson: the rest of the class will work with Mrs Busfield after half-term. Hoping everyone has a great holiday-wishing for lots of sunshine!
