In Numeracy we have continued to think about calculations and using empty number lines and tens and units to help us find the answers. We learnt about microhabitats in Science this week. We learnt about the animals that live in them and how they are suited to their environment. Yesterday afternoon we created butterflies using paper plates. We also re-released our own butterflies into the school garden too. We have one left in a chrysalis which we are hoping will hatch next week. We took advantage of the sunshine on Monday morning and went onto the field with Class One to practise for Sports Day which is a week on Saturday. Everyone did very well and we are looking forward to the real thing.

It has been a very warm week in Class 4! Thank you to those parents who managed to come to Open Doors, it is always lovely to see you and share our learning. In maths this week we have been learning how to multiply amounts of money and put the decimal point in the right place. We learnt to estimate first as a check-up. We then solved worded money problems, a very useful skill! In English we have been looking at information leaflets and deciding what makes them effective and how they persuade us to visit a place. We are now designing our own leaflets for Wycoller Park with photographs from our visit. We had a lovely, peaceful art afternoon in the heat, when some of us painted our pebbles and others painted watercolours of river birds and wildlife. In Science Year 4 have been investigating forces and using forcemeters to measure gravitational pull in Newtons, meanwhile, Year 5 used Scratch to work on programming with Mrs Wood. Next week we will swap over. We had a fantastic music afternoon on Monday with visitors from the youth choir, we learnt songs in a round and how to create beat box rhythms with our bodies.
