We have been learning how to show quarter past and quarter to and a few of us have even been showing time to the nearest 5 minutes which was very tricky! This morning we have sequenced time and worked out some time based problems. To complete our topic of observational drawings, we had a go at drawing each other on Wednesday. Yesterday afternoon we learnt about human and physical features in geography and thought about what was around us in Bradley. We hope everyone has a great, relaxing half term.

I can't believe it's half term already! We've packed a lot in. This week we have continued to learn about decimal numbers and their value. We have represented them in diagrams and shown whole numbers with decimal numbers. We are still trying to sharpen up our times tables with related division facts. In English we have learnt to use brackets and dashes for extra information and have revised the use of a colon. Through our topic on Italy we have learnt about the destruction of Pompeii, some children have visited the site and helped us by talking about their visit. We watched an interesting clip and researched ourselves. The children have written very interesting non-chronological reports remembering to include a wide range of punctuation. In art work we began experimenting with fine line drawings of Italian buildings, trying to create a 3D effect- the Colosseum and Leaning Tower of Pisa were the favourites!
